- iii. Special coaching classes for NET/SLET/UGC-CSIR pave way to the students to go further in their academic excellence.
- iv. Each student could enrich his/herself technical skills as the related opportunities do available in the department.
- v. The past history and positive trend which prevails in the department help each and every student to expand their knowledge in all aspects.

Challenges:
